Students will discuss trends and the future of fashion, from gender and sustainability to materiality, and learn to apply those concepts to the design and creation of a finished garment to add to their portfolio—or better yet, their wardrobe.

WHAT'S INCLUDED



TUITION

Students will take part in at least 25 hours of practical skills workshops and will design and construct their own garment for a run way show.



ACTIVITIES

We offer a variety of onsite evening activities including sports, discos and team games. Our activities provide opportunities for students to have fun and make international friends.
